Coeducational schools comprise **98.6%** of elementary and **70.0%** of secondary schools. At the secondary level, **12.7%** of the schools are male and **17.3%** are female.

29 states and the District of Columbia have legislation that provides some form of financial assistance to parents to help them choose a private or faithbased education for their children. Currently there are 61 publiclyfinanced programs (vouchers, scholarships, education savings accounts and tax relief) assisting more than 1.5 million families with financial resources that enable them to exercise choice in their selection of a school for their children.

Every Catholic school student receives a faithbased, academically excellent education that forms them in mind, body and spirit.
