CATHOLIC, JEWISH AGENCIES TO EXPLORE RELIGIOUS TRADITION AND SOCIAL POLICY

WASHINGTON--An interreligious exchange on the subject of "Religious Traditions and the Foundations of Social Policy" will be co-sponsored this spring by the Secretariat for Catholic-Jewish Relations of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops (NCCB) and the Synagogue Council of America (SCA).

The program will be held at the University of Notre Dame May 8-10.

The purpose is to provide Jewish and Catholic scholars and leaders with opportunity to explore the theological bases of their respective communities' involvement in social issues. The exchange will seek to clarify how each group draws on its biblical heritage and religious tradition in confronting such questions as: What is the impact of economic stress on the family? Does America need a national family policy? How should the United States apply human rights standards in meeting such international issues as violation of human rights or genocide?

A spokesman for the NCCB secretariat said the program is of major importance because it represents the most intensive dialogue
