Dear Friends,

It is with great honor and gratitude that I share with you the Catholic Campaign for Human Development's (CCHD) report for the 2021-2024 Synod: For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission. Submitted to USCCB in June 2022 as part of the "Region XVI" contributions, this report is the culmination of a listening process that took place from March to May 2022 with our over 12,000 current and former funded groups, diocesan coordinators and local committees, current and former interns, and lay Catholics involved in CCHD's work. We at CCHD would like to express our deepest gratitude to all those who took the time to share their feedback with us. Your candid, heartfelt, and vulnerable insights have touched us all and revealed the Holy Spirit at work in our communities and parishes. Please know that CCHD holds with great responsibility the sentiments and recommendations shared with us.

As such, we know the process does not end here and we look forward to the next step in the process to create the listening Church we seek. Pope Francis has invited us to continue this work to root synodality in the heart of our lives as disciples throughout the remainder of the newlyextended Synod on Synodality. CCHD's mission has always been to go to the periphery and spend significant time listening and discernment with those whose voices have been muted. We at CCHD want to be sure that voices that are often ignored or deliberately quieted are amplified in this effort and continue to be heard.

I hope this report will be the first step in an ongoing process of listening, discernment, and accompaniment as we seek to live out the mission of Jesus Christ "to bring good news to the poor ... release to captives ... sight to the blind, and let the oppressed go free" (Luke 4:18). In the coming weeks, we will be in touch with how you can help us to discern our next steps in this work of synodality to walk in solidarity with our brothers and sisters on the margins.

With your help, CCHD continues to assist those who struggle and share the Good News at the same time. We can indeed celebrate a proud 50-plus years of existence and have a firm foundation to approach an uncertain future. I thank God daily for your dedication, your commitment, and your tireless witness on behalf of the poor.
